Introductory Course – Step 1 in the MAT Series

A general overview of the medications used in MAT that are available through the DMC-ODS Waiver. The overview shall address each specific medication, including the primary use for treatment and the relationship, if any, with other medications available for treatment. The training will cover the theory of MAT and how MAT can be utilized to treat substance use disorders.

Learning Objectives:

1. Learn how to describe acute and chronic effects of alcohol and opioids
2. Understand the prevalence of, and key populations impacted by, alcohol and opioid use and abuse
3. Become familiar with medications that are available to treat alcohol and opioid addiction

California Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Treatment/Contract Providers and County Staff who are engaged in the Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System (DMC-ODS) process.
